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ELEVENTH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF COPTIC STUDIES,  
CLAREMONT, 25–30 JULY 2016: FIRST ANNOUNCEMENT

The Organizing Committee invites you to the Eleventh International Congress of Coptic Studies, which is to take place in Claremont, California, USA, from Monday 25 to Saturday 30 July 2016. The Congress organization is a collaborative effort of the host, the Claremont Graduate University (150 East 10th Street, Claremont CA 91711), and the St. Shenouda the Archimandrite Coptic Society, under the auspices of the IACS. The proceedings will be arranged as follows:

1. Plenary sessions during which invited specialists will give reports on recent developments in the major domains of Coptic studies, as follows:

2. The Congress invites all scholars to submit papers dealing with any of the aspects of the study of Christian Egypt in such areas as those covered in the plenary papers, as well as any related subjects (subject to the discretion of the Congress organizers). Papers should not exceed 20 minutes in length. The deadline for submitting a paper proposal (with an abstract of up to 300 words) is 1 February 2016. Due to the large number of papers anticipated, *participants with no history of presenting at international meetings are asked to submit the entire text of their proposed paper* for consideration no later than 1 December 2015 (submission must be by email or mail to the addresses given below). Titles and abstracts can be transmitted online as a part of the registration process (on which see further below), or you may use email to the Congress Secretary, Mr. Hany N. 3. We encourage senior and established scholars to organize special panels or workshops to be scheduled as part of the Congress program. Proposals for such special

sessions should be communicated by email to the Congress Secretary as soon as possible ([htakla@CopticCongress2016.org](mailto:htakla@CopticCongress2016.org)).

4. The Congress will close with the Business Meeting of the IACS on Saturday morning, 30 July.

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<sup>1</sup> The Congress fee for a normal IACS member has been set at US\$ 180; for student and retired members, and for Friends of the IACS as well as accompanying persons, the fee is US\$ 90. N.B.: These fees are valid only if they are paid in advance; at the time of the Congress itself, fees will be much higher, as they are in any case for non-IACS members (see the Congress website). *For Egyptians who reside in Egypt*, there are special reduced fees (EGP 250 for most, EGP 150 for students and for any Friend of the IACS), which may be paid either in advance or at the time of the Congress. An *institutional member of the IACS* is entitled to send one representative to the Congress with the status of a normal IACS member.
